**Entry Requirements** Satisfactorily completed an AQF 7 Bachelor (or equivalent) from an institution recognised by the Academic Board; OR Qualify for professional entry as determined by the Student Support and Administration Committee; AND Satisfactorily complete a pre-enrolment interview with a relevant course advisor.

**Duration:** 0.5 years full-time or 1.5 years (maximum) part-time.

**Attendance Type:** Full-time, part-time.

**Delivery Mode:** Online, face-to-face, or multi-modal

**Structure:** 36 credit points from the list of approved Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy units listed in the Schedule below.

### English Proficiency:

Applicants whose entry qualifications were obtained in an institution where English is not the language of instruction normally require a minimum IELTS (or equivalent) score of 7.0 with no score less than 6.5 in all bands of the test.

### Graduate Profile and Rationale

The Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy is designed for those possessing a three-year undergraduate degree in any field who wish to acquire transferable knowledge and skills in Chaplaincy as part of their continuing professional development for ministry employment and further learning.

The Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy focuses on building capacity in Chaplaincy for people involved in a wide scope of religious, non-profit, community-focused enterprises. Students may be working for denominationally-based organisations in education, welfare, aged care, local church or other ministries requiring specific leadership training for ministry or mission.

## **Course Outcomes**

### **Knowledge**

Graduates will have:

- specialised theoretical and technical knowledge related to the practice of Chaplaincy which are transferable to a variety of complex religious, not-for-profit, ministry enterprises.

### **Skills**

Graduates will demonstrate specialised cognitive and technical skills in Chaplaincy within a ministry-related body of knowledge, so that they are able independently to:

- analyse critically, evaluate, and apply information to complete a range of activities associated with Chaplaincy in a ministry related context;
- analyse, generate and provide solutions to complex problems to guide the ministry in the field of Chaplaincy within a religious, not-for-profit, community organization;
- transmit transferable knowledge, skills and ideas through coherent and sustained ministry in Chaplaincy to specialist and non-specialist audiences.

### **Applications of Knowledge and Skills**

Graduates will have the ability to:

- Apply transferable knowledge and skills in a way that demonstrates autonomy, well-developed judgment, adaptability, and responsibility as leaders in religious, non-profit, community-focused enterprises.

## **Academic regulations for the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy**

### **1 Admission to Candidature**

- 1.1 An applicant for admission to candidature into the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy shall:
- 1.1.1 hold a completed an AQF 7 Bachelor (or equivalent) from an institution recognised by the Academic Board; OR
  - 1.1.2 qualify for professional entry as determined by the Student Support and Administration Committee. This award is a course for professional development where the student may acquire transferable knowledge and skills over a reasonably short period of time. On this basis, professional entry into the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy will be considered by the Student Support and Administration Committee on the basis of three years' experience in a ministry or professional role. The candidate must be able to demonstrate that they have led people or projects even though their role may not have been senior in their organization; AND
  - 1.1.3 satisfactorily complete a pre-enrolment interview with a relevant course advisor.
- 1.2 Notwithstanding the provisions of this regulation the Student Support and Administration Committee may require an applicant to demonstrate fitness for admission as a candidate for this degree by carrying out such work and/or sitting for such examinations as the Student Support and Administration Committee may determine.
- 1.3 In exceptional cases an applicant may be admitted as a candidate for a Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy if the applicant submits evidence of other academic and professional attainments to the Student Support and Administration Committee.
- 1.4 A candidate for the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy shall be designated as full-time or part-time. A candidate is designated as a full-time if enrolled in three units (27 credit points) or more in a semester or part-time if enrolled in less than three units (27 credit points) per semester.
- 1.5 No candidate for the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy may be concurrently enrolled in any other undergraduate or postgraduate course within the University College or any other tertiary institution unless approval has been granted by the Academic Board.
- 1.6 Applicants whose entry qualifications were obtained in an institution where English is not the language of instruction normally will be required to demonstrate competency in English by:
- 1.6.1 achieving an IELTS (or equivalent) result of 7.0 with no score below 6.5 in all bands of the test.
- 1.7 Application for enrolment in the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy is made to the Registrar of the appropriate Member Institution offering the course.

### **2 Course Structure**

2.1 The Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy requires the completion of 36 credit points from 8100 and 9200 series units in the University College Schedule of Units of Study.

2.2 The units will be any combination of units totaling 36 credit points from the list of approved Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy units listed in Schedule below.

2.3 Units coded "A" are not counted towards a Concentration or Specialisation in any discipline or subdiscipline.

### **3 Period of Candidature**

3.1 The period of candidature for the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy shall normally be 0.5 years full- time and up to 1.5 years part-time.

3.2 In certain circumstances the Student Support and Administration Committee may grant course extensions.

### **4 Leave of Absence**

4.1 The Student Support and Administration Committee may grant leave of absence from the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy. The period of leave shall not be counted as part of the period of candidature for the award.

4.2 The period of leave shall normally be one semester after which a candidate may apply for a further period of one semester or will be required to complete candidature.

### **5 Assessment**

5.1 The assessment of units shall be in the manner approved by the Academic Board in line with the University College's established guidelines for assessment packages.

5.2 Students may be required by the Academic Board to present themselves for oral examination.

5.3 Academic and non-academic misconduct will be penalised in accordance with the Policies and Regulations of the University College, whose stipulations are severe.

### **6 Credit**

6.1 A candidate may seek credit up to a maximum of 18 credit points in the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy.

6.2 Credit will be granted for units that are from an equivalent award or institution and have outcomes, content, demand hours, and assessment equivalent to that of units in the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy.

6.3 Credit for Recognised Prior Learning may be granted subject to a successful application.

## **7 Progress to Further Awards**

7.1 Students who satisfactorily complete the Graduate Certificate in Chaplaincy will be eligible to articulate with full credit to the University College Graduate Diploma of Arts or other postgraduate awards, provided that they meet the entry requirements of that award.

## **8 Saving Clause**

8.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Academic Board of the University College may, in any case in which it may deem it appropriate to do so, vary, dispense with, or suspend any requirement or prescription by these regulations, and report forthwith to the Council of the University College.
